Meanwhile, find out what happens back on Earth as you take an interactive look at meteors and impacts through a variety of experiences. Did the catastrophic event that did-in the dinos come from outer space, and could it happen again? Find out if meteor showers are caused by chunks of rock or bits of dust. Use scientific tests on a suspected rock to see if it really is a fallen meteorite...or a "meteor wrong".

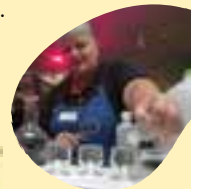

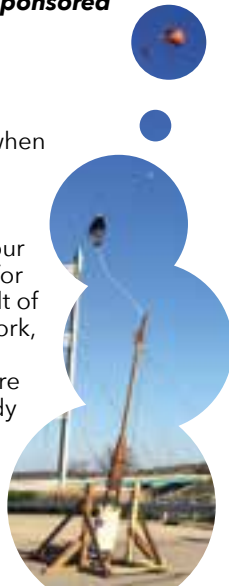

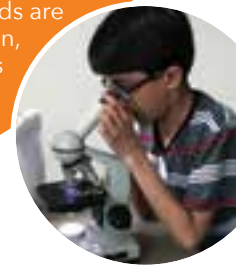

Totem pole returns!

A longtime fixture in Discovery Park, our totem pole is back after being removed for an extensive restoration. It had been a fixture in the park since its installation in June, 2000. The pole depicts characters that work in different fields of science: chemist, educator, astronaut, engineer, physician and explorer.

Carved by volunteers from the Blackhawk Woodcarvers of Rockford over a 6-month period in 1999-2000, the pole had suffered severe damage and deterioration.

Stenstrom Company generously donated the services of a crane and crew to gently lift the 16-foot white oak pole from its base so it could be moved into Discovery Center's exhibit shop. The totem pole was brought back to life through a restoration process that involved removing and replacing damaged areas, adding metal support rods, filling cracks and sealing.

Discovery Center staff and visitors are grateful to The Blackhawk Woodcarvers who came to the rescue to restore the totem pole. Club members Denny Neubauer, Mike Petty, Gale Terrell, Tony DaVita and Dick Dunphey volunteered their skills and many hours to return the pole to its former glory. Mr. DaVita and Mr. Terrell were part of the group that originally carved the pole 17 years ago. Thanks to these dedicated volunteers, we can look forward to our Totem Pole overlooking Discovery Park for many years to come!

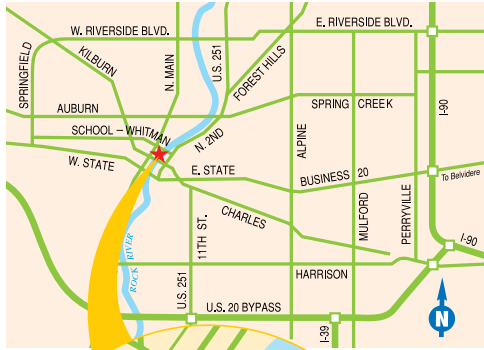
