

STEM Summer Camp Health Guidelines

Your child's health, and the health of our staff, is of the utmost importance. Our team has made modifications to our building, exhibits and summer camp practices in accordance with public health guidelines and industry best practices. In particular, we will follow Restore Illinois COVID-19 2020 Day Camp guidelines. Protocols may be updated based on guidance from local, state and CDC guideline.

Some of our updates include:

- Smaller camp group sizes and expanded classroom space;
- Campers may have time to explore in the Museum without the general public. This private playtime will be separated by camp groups;
- Personal material kits for each camper, offering one-user only supplies for experiences throughout the day;
- Increased hand washing throughout the camp day, plus easy access to hand sanitizer and wipes in each classroom;
- Daily staff and camper health screenings;
- All staff will be wearing face coverings;
- Social distancing reminder signage;
- Separate camper entrance
- Participants will be required to wear face covering over their nose and mouth at all times except when outside and able to maintain a safe social distance (exceptions can be made for people with medical conditions or disabilities that prevent them from safely wearing a face covering).
